COMMANDER IN CHIEF

The president is commander in chief of the U.S. armed forces. This means all of the military leaders report to and take orders from the president.

Examples of the president acting as commander in chief:

- 3. Call out the National Guard to stop a riot

CHIEF EXECUTIVE

The president is the chief executive, empower to administer the laws and affairs of the nation. While the president does NOT make the laws, his agencies have the responsibility to carry out the laws.

CHIEF OF STATE

CHIEF DIPLOMAT

Being a diplomat involves interacting with the leaders from other nations. The president takes the lead in foreign relations by associating with foreign leaders and developing a foreign policy with other nations.

CHIEF LEGISLATOR

Though the president cannot make laws, he can voice his own ideas and opinions to Congress while they draft legislation. He does this through speeches promoting his agendas and by meeting with Congress to discuss policies.
